

Grade 10 Sample Lesson Plan: Role Goals

SOLs

- Explain reasons why teenagers use or avoid drugs or alcohol and how positive role models can influence that decision.
- Calculate the importance of support and encouragement from positive role models.

Objectives/Goals

- The student will be able to accurately define what a role model is, what makes a good role model, and why we look up to the people that we do.
- The student will identify the value/characteristic of their role model that is most important to them.
- The student will set a goal and create a plan to improve that value/characteristic within themselves
- The student will write a letter to that person detailing why they chose the characteristic/value that they did, and how they plan to improve that value/characteristic within themselves

Materials

- <u>Role Goals Presentation</u>
- Role Goals Packet

Procedure

Step 1	 Handout the role goals packet and have the role goals presentation up on the projector Have the students write down their own definition of what a role model is 	Essential Questions:
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Step 2	 Have the students get into groups of 3 or 4 with their neighbors Give each group a sheet of paper for the snowball activity One group member writes as the group comes up 5 characteristics of a good role model Then, when the teacher says to, the students ball up their list and throw it into the middle One group member goes and picks up a new sheet and they write down 2 more new characteristics Repeat for 4 rounds 	
Step 3	 Have the students create one giant list of characteristics on the board of all the things they wrote down Discuss some of the characteristics as a class 	
Step 4	 Have the students write down what types of people are role models Discuss the students answers as a class Show the video of charles barkley in the presentation Discuss with the class that not all role models are positive 	Video of Charles Barkley professing that he is not a role model. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch</u> <u>?v=4gqk4WPnrpM</u>
Step 5	 Go through the powerpoint explaining my own role model and the characteristics I picked Go over what a SMART goal is Work through the examples in the PP slides as a class discussion Explain to the students that they are going to set SMART goals to improve these

	 characteristics within themselves and create a plan of action to achieve it O Include obstacles that may come up and get in the way of the plan 	
Step 6	• Go through the powerpoint and explain each goal, the time table for the goal, plan, and obstacles for the plan	
Step 7	 Show the video The Dash in the powerpoint. Explain and discuss with the students what the poem means and how they feel about it. Explain to the students that they are to write a letter to their role model explaining why they chose them, their goals, and plan of action 	The Poem "The Dash" read aloud. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch</u> <u>?v=HVLqkExH5ww</u>
Step 8	• Let the students complete their packet and answer any questions they might have	


