Objectives/Goals

- The student will define teasing and bullying and provide examples of each
- The student will investigate ways to show respect and care for other students
- The student will create a product to promote a caring school environment

Materials

• Performance Task: Caring School Environment Performance Task

Steps

- Review the steps of the performance task before introducing it to your students.
- Pass out a copy of the performance task to each student and review the expectations. Provide a due date.
- Once project are completed, decide if each group will implement their product within a classroom, grade level, or school.

Caring School Environment Performance Task

Imagine that student absenteeism is on the rise. The cause of the problem is teasing and bullying. Many students feel unsafe at school, thus are absent from school to find comfort is their safe home environment. Your mission is to investigate the problem and find a way to create a caring school environment for all students.

Step 1: Survey Others

Survey 4 students from another grade level to find out how they feel about the school environment. Encourage students to expand on their answers. You will record their responses on the survey. Do not record their name.



Step 2: Collaborate and Summarize

In small groups of three, share your survey results with your group. Consider the following questions:

- Do students feel cared for at your school ?
- Is teasing and bullying a problem at your school? Is teasing and bullying a problem among specific grade levels or among students in general?
- Where does teasing and bullying occur at school?
- How did your survey results compare or contrast to your group members results?

Write a ½ page paper summarizing and reflecting on your survey results and your group members' results. Consider the questions listed above as you write your paper.



Step 3: Create a Product

As a small group, discuss how you could promote a more caring school environment. Think about if you are going to target the whole school, a specific grade level, or a class. Choose one of the following product options from the Project Choice Board.

Posters	Flyers	Brochures
Class Presentation	Student Choice (get teacher permission)	Public Service Announcement Video for the Morning Announcements

Do additional research and include the following in your product:

- Define teasing and provide 3 or more examples of teasing
- Define bullying and provide 3 or more examples of bullying
- 5 or more ways to show respect and care for other students
- Other relevant information
- Relevant pictures and images to enhance your product

Step 4: Write a Letter to School Administration

Write a letter to administration to describe your plan of action (product) and how this will promote a more caring school environment. Include the following in your letter:

- Describe why it is important to create a caring school environment
- Include the results from your survey and your group members' surveys
- Describe your plan of action (product) and how it will create a more caring environment

Step 5: Make a Difference

With teacher permission, use your product to create a more caring school environment for students.
