# **Mystery Bag**

## **Learning Objectives**

• I can identify items that can be reused [K.1.r]

#### **Teacher Notes**

- Reuse means to use an item more than once
- Students will show their answer through exercise
  - o as a class identify an exercise to show the answer of TRASH (windmill) and an exercise to show the answer of REUSING (knee to elbow)
- We will go through a mystery bag of 10 trash and reusable items and each round students will
  do the exercise that corresponds with their answer of whether they believe it is reusable or not
  (trash)

### Step 1 Introduction

### Step 2 Activity



### Step 3 Closure

#### **Assessments**

- Pre-Assessment: Call and Response (If something can be reused, what does that mean? We can use it more than once.)
- Post-Assessment: Thumbs Up/Thumbs Down (If something can be reused, what does that mean? We can use it more than once.)
