

# **Safety Practices**

#### **Learning Objectives**

- I can identify a poison warning label.
- I can describe ways medicine can be helpful and ways it can be harmful.

#### **Teacher Notes**

- Follow along with the video.
- This lesson will include pauses that will involve student response or time to complete the activity. Please pause the video as instructed for as long as needed.

#### **Lesson Steps: Video Outline K.1k Video**

#### Step 1 Introduction

- Did you know there are rules everywhere we go to help keep us safe?
- Can you name at least 3 rules to help keep you safe when you are walking somewhere? Riding your bike? Riding a bus? On a playground?

#### Step 2 Activity

- Make a list of at least 3 rules that keep us safe when walking, riding a bike, riding a bus or on a playground.
- Activity: Red Light, Green Light!
  - 4 Rounds (1 round each for walking, biking, bus, playground)
  - All students start on one side of the space, when teacher says, "Green Light" students can start walking toward the "finish line"
  - When the teacher says, "Red Light" students will stop and will have to answer a
    question about a rule that helps keep them safe while doing the activity that round is
    designated for (ex. what is one rule that helps us stay safe when riding our bike?)
  - upon answering that correctly the teacher can say "Green Light" again and will repeat with "Red Light" until students can identify at least 3 rules to keep them safe
  - o Complete 4 rounds total

#### Step 3 Closure

- Do you know why we have rules?
- If you don't know the rules, how could you learn them?



#### **Assessments**

- Pre: Questions will introduce topic, engage learners, and access prior knowledge
- Post: The activity will demonstrate student understanding of material covered during class. Teacher will observe student choices to determine level of understanding.

### **Extensions/Connections/Applications**

- The teacher can have more discussion as desired with students throughout the lesson.
- The teacher can hold up the colors rather than say them to help students identify colors with go and stop.
